FEAR N. Y. STRIKE MAY SPREAD ALL OVER THE NATION

New York, March 4.—(AP)—A threat of a Nation-wide strike of building service workers was added today to indications by strike leaders that the walk-out of building workers in New York might be extended to other labor fields.

Orange, March 4.—(AP)—Mrs. Edith Nichols, 25, of Wakelee Court, Stratford, was arrested today by Chief Carl Peterson of the Orange police and held in bonds of \$1,000 for arraignment March 9 in the town court on a technical charge of idleness.

Chief Peterson said Mrs. Nichols was taken into custody on complaint of a motorist, whose identity was not disclosed, after the latter had complained to him that a woman hitch-hiker had held him up at the foot of a hill near the West Haven line.

Questioned by Torrance about the motorist, she was quoted as saying she had carried the gun "as I do my hitch-hike" for the past six months.

Torrance said: "The fact that you carried a gun is a disgraceful thing."
