

A new and much modified bill for Federal regulation of the textile industry was completed today and will be introduced late in the day by Representative Ellenbogen (D., Pa.).

The new measure omitted many provisions to which employers objected during hearings before a House subcommittee.

In its revised form, which is expected to receive a favorable reportfrom the House labor subcommittee either Friday or Monday, the bill provides for creation of a textile commission, establishes a uniform minimum wage of \$15 a week, maximum hours of 35 a week, and gives the 'commission power to fix graded minimum wages for skilled and semi-skilled workers.
