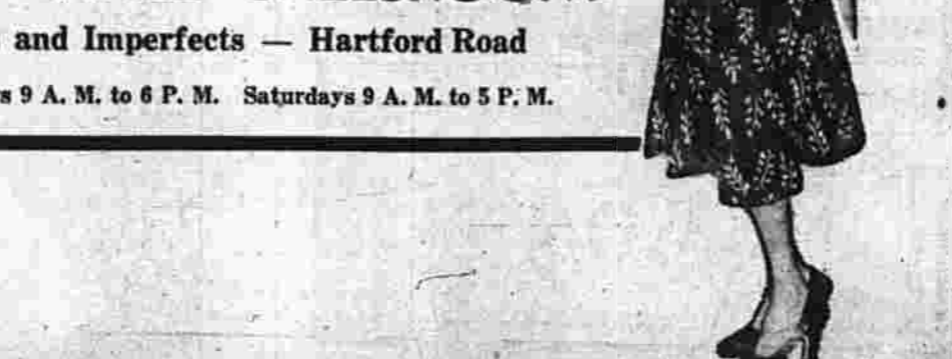

League Council Agrees to Der Fuehrer's Demands for Equality But Turns Down Proposal That Council Must Discuss Peace.

London, March 13.—(AP)—The League of Nations Council, in secret session, agreed today to return to Der Fuehrer Hitler's demands for equality, but flatly rejected his "condition" that the Council must discuss peace proposals.

Hitler had offered to send a representative to the Council's deliberations on Germany's renunciation of the Rhineland only on a basis of full equality in the conference and with the understanding that his recent offer of new peace proposals would be considered.

Six nations headed by France proposed Hitler's conditions on bringing his peace proposals up for discussion.

The vote was interpreted as tantamount to a qualified refusal of Hitler's conditions.

The Council was agreed that Germany was entitled to sit in the Council on an equal footing with the other nations.

It was understood that the Council decided to draft still another agreement to Germany to ratify the League of Nations.
