New York. (AP)—The death of Bruno Richard Hauptmann is the climax of a drama of human emotions which has stirred virtually the entire civilized world for nearly four years.

The chain of events in which Hauptmann was convicted for the murder of the baby, Charles Augustus Lindbergh, Jr., was snatched from his mother's arms on the night of March 1, 1932, and taken to a house in Hopedale, N. J., on the morning of March 2, 1932.

During the time between the kidnapping and the arrest of Hauptmann, the forces of law worked to find the child and to identify the kidnaper.

On May 13, 1935, almost two years after the kidnapping, the world learned that the baby had been killed in the night. It was a shock to the world.
