A body easily identified as that of Leclair because of a fragment of his long grey beard which the flames had not touched. Around the man's neck had been tied tightly a piece of cloth. So taut was it drawn that a part of the heard, and the wrinkled skin beneath it had been shielded from the fire which charred the rest of the body beyond identification.

Hints at Murder

That tightly drawn cloth is what convinces provincial authorities that murder may have been done before the flames all but obliterated the evidence. What Was Found

Finally he built the home which now is ashes; and the Dedevoirs came to live with him. People presumed that the couple had some arrangement whereby they would care for the old Leclair in return for a home.
