



"It is well recognized that the corporate form of doing business enjoys certain advantages over individual and partnership businesses. The existing law creates purely artificial disadvantages in others, depending upon the size of the enterprise and character of ownership.

"Individuals and partnerships cannot minnige their taxes by failure to distribute their business earnings. Corporations should not be permitted to withhold from the beneficial shareholders unneeded corporate income at the expense of the evenues of the United States and to the detriment of the shareholders.
