Slight increases were reported in gas sales in some months preceding December last year, but it was not until the final month of the year that the curve shot sharply upward. Sales to domestic customers gatarted to rise markedly in January, after use of gas for household purposes had trailed disproportionately behind its use for industrial and commercial purposes for nearly two years. The reasons for this were the enforced household economies of fre depression and the combining of fermilies under one roof. In January the domestic demand for gas gained hearly eight: percent over the first month of 1935, and the rise in use now continues.

Business Use Increases

Use of gas industrially and commercially which made substantial gains during the last half of 1935 went still further shead as 1936 took its place on the calendar, rising 16 per cent above 1935 figures in January and subsequently continuing along that level. This increase in the employment of gas by industry is due to some extent to industrial improvement but can also be attributed to the fact that more and more uses for gas in industriat heating processes have been developed in recent years through an intensive research program conducted by the gas companies through the American Gas Association laboratory. Thus a large part of the gain can be credited to the substitution of the easily controlled temperatures of gas heat for other
