The stock of these companies was acquired in brief as follows: In 1928 the Connecticut Power Company made an offer to the stockholders of the Bolton Electric Company...

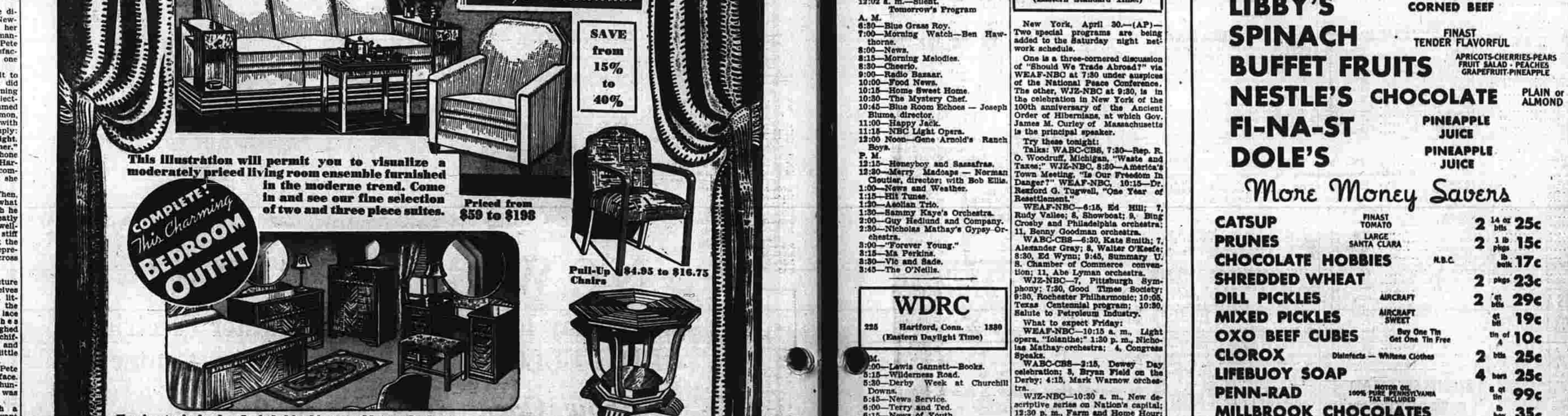
