## MRS. HUXFORD'S FUNERA

Descendant of Prominent Connecticut Family Died Satur-day Night— Widow of Army

of a prominent Connecticut and Maine family distinguished in public service, and mother of Judge Frederick W. Huxford of the Fairfield county Juvenile Court, was buried today.

The widow of Major William Pitkin Huxford, U. S. A. retired, who is buried in Arlington cemetery, died here Saturday night.

She was born in Rockland, Me., Feb. 9, 1845, a daughter of the Rev. Samuel Clement and Mary Abigail Abbe Fessenden. Following her father's retirement from the ministry, he entered public life and the field of education.

He represented his Congressional district in Maine in the first Civil War Congress and was a member of the delegation which went from Chicago to Springfield, Ill., in 1860 to notify Abraham Lincoln of his nomination.

The family came to Stamford in 1865. Three of Mrs. Huxford's brothers distinguished themselves in the city's public life while a fourth served with equal distinction in the Army.

Mrs. Huxford was married Oct. 23, 1873. Her husband was Major William Pitkin Huxford, for 24 years recorder of the District of Columbia Commandry, Military Order of the Loyal Legion of the United States. He was also registrar-in their of the Order for a number of years.

A few years after the death of her husband in 1910, Mrs. Huxford returned to Connecticut from Washington, D. C., where the couple had made their home.
