# DIETITIAN CAN SAVE MUCH FOR HOSPITAL

### Her Work is Varied and Her Problems Many But She Can Make or Break the Hospital's Purse; Miss Gordon Tells What is Required of Her.

So many people ask—What does the dietitian do? Her duties are chiefly concerned with food but in spite of this, her work is varied. While in their size they are different, her problems are very similar to those of the housewife. She plans menus, buys food, and supervises the cooking and serving of that food. She also sees that there is no waste of food. To do this she washes the garbage that leaves the kitchen and keeps an eye on the temperature of the refrigerator. There will be no loss from food spoilage.

She sees that the kitchen is kept clean, that the floor is scrubbed, the silver kept bright and shining. The kitchen equipment must be kept in good working order. This involves the co-operation of the engineer for steam in used extensively in hospital kitchens to cook vegetables, keep foods and dishes warm, for stock pots, cereal cookers and hot water and coffee urns. Where gas is used burners must be watched constantly for leakage or badly burning plates. It allowed to go uncorrected, the result would result in a considerable loss of gas and cooking efficiency.

PLAN TO CUT DOWN ON PUBLIC WORKS

President Says WPA Will Furnish Most of the Labor Now Under Consideration

Washington, May 15 (AP)—President Roosevelt said today that the public works and readjustment administrations would be continued on a somewhat smaller scale over the pending \$1,425,000,000 work re-act appropriation.

Responding to questions at his press conference, the President said that certain municipal projects which have been carried out under the Public Works Administration (PWA) in the past would qualify under the new program. He said that the PWA would furnish 65 per cent of the funds to pay the labor, he said, while the 35 per cent would come out of PWA's readjustment fund.
