RESETTLEMENT WORK'S FUTURE IN DISPUTE

Cummings Says Only One Project Is Banned, Others Hold "Whole Program Has Gone Into Ashcan."

Washington, May 12 (AP)—The future of the \$275,000,000 Resettlement Administration remained in dispute today, although officials in the department of the interior might be pushed forward with funds are available.

The district of Columbia Court of Appeals decision yesterday, Attorney General Cummings said, declared only one type of resettlement project, the one for the former congressional districts, was to be abandoned.

Resettlement officials remained silent. An assistant to Administrator Robert C. Taylor, former newsmen to the Justice Department for Columbus, Ga., said:

Affects Single Project. Cummings said in a formal statement in a three-to-two decision of the United States court of appeals for the District of Columbia, it was decided that the suburban housing project for the Resettlement Administration in Bound Brook, N. J., was authorized.

The activity was an interference with the reserved powers of the states and in violation of the lawful delegation of legislative power by Congress. The decision was limited to the particular type of project involved, and, as it interpreted it, was not intended to apply to other agencies of the government nor to other activities of the Resettlement Administration.

These other low cost housing projects of the administration which were said to be exactly the same type as that planned for Bound Brook, these are at Searcy, Mich.; at Milwaukee, Wis.; with the Bound Brook in New York; and in other parts of the country.

Construction was reported well under way at Bound Brook, and in the initial stages at Cincinnati and Milwaukee. It was said to have been started at Bound Brook.

REACH AGREEMENT ON SILVER BUYING U. S. and China Now in Accord About White Metal; Strengthens Currency.

Shanghai, May 12 (AP)—The United States agreement to purchase Chinese silver, providing China with dollar exchange, resulted from American government agencies aimed at strengthening further the Chinese currency, the minister of finance disclosed today.

The Nationalist government minister of finance, H. H. Kung, said, "during the last six months the Chinese government has developed its efforts to develop and strengthen the measures for monetary reform adopted Nov. 3, 1935, which have resulted in an attainment of exchange stability at a level adjusted to China's economic life."

To achieve this further strengthening of Chinese currency, definite measures had been made to increase the gold and foreign exchange portion of the nation's total "gold reserves."

The finance ministry said the announcement made by Secretary of the Treasury Morgenthau at Washington last yesterday, of the silver purchase agreement, was a first outcome of recently completed Sino-American financial undertakings at Washington.

Some of the details of the agreement were disclosed by the minister of finance. He said that the United States would supply the silver purchase agreement, which would be in the form of a loan, to be repaid by the United States.

The American purchase which Secretary Morgenthau's announcement anticipates will extend over a period of months, involving a considerable amount of the white metal.

Refuting long-crested rumors that China was abandoning its interest in silver, Morgenthau's announcement was made in a statement of the official Chinese press.

"Henceforth, the silver portion of our reserves will be at least 25 per cent."
