





Tungsten Filament Type of Illumination Won't Be Read-ily Discarded.

Newington, May 22—Any belief that tungsten filament lamps face an early declining use as a source of illumination because of the recent success of vapor illuminants only the real facts.

That was the opinion voiced by Richard G. Slauer lighting expert of the Westinghouse Lamp Company, Bloomfield, N. J., in a talk before the Hariford County Employer's Executives of New Britain, Bristol, and Hartford, at the Indian Hill County Club here last night.

"A cold analysis of artificial lighting indicates that much greater progress than is visioned even today must be made before the incandescent lamp can ever be discarded," says Mr. Slauer.

"First of all, the purpose of any general work like source is to replace or supplement sunlight.

"The incandescent lamp, with its endless possibilities of size and types, its great simplicity of installation and operation, and its low cost, still awaits a genuine challenge.

"Undoubtedly, any radical de-

"Undoubtedly, any radical departure in the family of artificial light sources will fit into the general picture of illumination much as the airplane has fitted into that of transportation."

The vapor lamp sources which have been receiving widespread attention as a revolutionary source of illumination for highways, city streets, and industrial areas, opens up a vision of tremendously greater efficiencies from light sources, but without the universal flexibility of the incandescent lamp, Mr. Slauer pointed out. It must be "formfitted" to applications for which it is best suited.






