BELGIUM'S REX PARTY WINS 21 SEATS IN TEST

Socialists Get Plurality in Parliament Election But New Rexist Group Looms on Bank-Finance Issue.

Brussels, May 28.—(AP)—Belgium's Socialists won the greatest representation in the new Parliament, virtually complete returns from the general election showed today, placing their 70-year-old leader, Emile Vandervelde, in a position to form the nation's next premier.

The new party of Rexist, whose political emblem is a cardboard barrel, symbolizing determination to "renew" bankers and politicians, emerged as a strong force, mainly at the expense of Conservative Catholics. The Socialists, however, retained their early lead.

Official standings, subject possibly to slight revision, gave: Socialists, 70; Catholics, 63; Liberals, 23; Rexist, 21; Flemish Nationalists, 16; Communists, 9.

The Catholics lost the most seats—18. The Socialists, although holding their own, lost 10 seats. The Flemish Nationalists gained eight seats, the Communists six.

The Rexist party, an outspoken leader, Leon Degrelle, celebrated his 50th birthday today. He has 17,519 votes with returns from two provinces.

This militant, disident Catholic party received its greatest success in the province of Liege, where 50,000 Rexist votes were cast. He said he was not himself a candidate, but that he was being seriously mentioned for the Republican nomination.

Old Guard, New York Faction to Organize a New Marxist Group.

Cleveland, May 28.—(AP)—Once more the Social Party of New York is split into two factions. The "Old Guard" of New York, led by Louis Waldman, set forth today a plan to organize a new Marxist Party, not only in New York but on a National basis.

The split came yesterday after the 34th annual convention of the Socialist Party of New York, in which the executive committee and the leadership of Norman Thomas, turned down the "Old Guard" and seated the Thomas-Lefist delegation from New York.

Captain Martin McCormick said Armbruster quoted his wife as saying: "I had a gun I'd shot myself."

Armbruster later told a physician that he had shot his wife with a .38-caliber revolver. He said he had shot her in the back of the head, and that she had died.

"I don't know how to use it," she had said.

Shows Her How to Use It. The captain said Armbruster told him he then picked up the weapon, raised the bolt, caught and fired a shot into the bureau.

McCormick said Armbruster first informed him he had shot his wife with a .38-caliber revolver. He said he had shot her in the back of the head, and that she had died.

CLINGS TO BOAT; FOUR FRIENDS DIE

Companions Drowned One by One in Twenty-four Hours Out on Lake.

The victims, in addition to Reagin, were: Clarence McLeod, 37; Arnold Wolf, 35, and Philip Drinkwater, 34.

Reagin, recovering in the home of Constable John Messers at Belle River, Ont., one of his rescuers, said the boat capsized about dusk Saturday, three miles from the Canadian shore in a high wind.
