### STRIKES SPREADING THROUGHOUT GAIN 30,000 More Added As Miners Quit Work; Demand Back Pay.

Madrid, June 5.—(AP)—Members of the Rightist opposition of the Cortes Parliament withdrew today after a dispute over parabolic schools as Spanish labor difficulties continued to intensify.
