TAX BILL IS PASSED BY SENATE 37 TO 24

Few Traces of Roosevelt's Ideas Incorporated in Measure; Goes to House for Conference.

Washington, June 7.—(AP)—Sped through the Senate by a vote of 37 to 24, a tax bill containing only faint traces of President Roosevelt's ideas headed today into a Senate-House conference where administration men will battle for five or six weeks on every article of the bill.

Many legislators agreed that the bill is a "tax" bill, but it is not a "tax" bill in the sense that it will take places in this conference and the bill may emerge entirely rewritten.

After three days of debate, a tired Senate will vote on the bill late today or tomorrow. The bill is expected to pass by a narrow margin.

MONTHLY COLLECTIONS
 Unless the property owners of Manchester are willing to pay their annual tax every month or perhaps every two months, and unless town officials are willing to collect taxes frequently, there will be no respite from the present situation which the present awkward arrangement of fiscal-year dates can be rearranged without increasing in some measure the tax burden of property owners.

To permit a more orderly schedule of fiscal dates the town must either underwrite the cost of governmental services for a portion of a year, followed immediately with another tax for an entire year, or it must combine the two taxes in one sufficient to meet a budget for a period longer than 12 months.

The cost of government for the months between the present starting date of the fiscal year and whatever starting date should be adopted can be met by an increased tax, 50 per cent greater for a six months period, or by bonding for the expenses of the intervening period.

A bond issue sufficiently large to finance a change of four or five months, issued against the uncollected taxes on grand list of the year, would work the least apparent hardship.

But it would eliminate the cause of back taxes which annually helps to make up in part for inability to collect 100 per cent.

The monthly collection of property taxes offers the least painful plan of transition. Theoretically at least, it would be no more difficult for taxpayers to pay 50 per cent more than usual in 12 monthly installments than it would be to pay the usual tax in 12 installments during a year, as at present.

The monthly collection of taxes might easily result in a better collection record. It would present no increased burden to those who pay aside money each month to meet their tax bill and should make it easier for less thrifty persons who wait until the tax is due before trying to "arape up" the tax money.
