

"He promised economy; he gave economy," Hamilton asserted. "He promised co-operation with the Legislature. He promised appointment on that basis. He swore to uphold the Constitution and he upheld it, for to him the Constitution was not an obstacle to be circumvented but a tool to be rightly used."
