THIRD PARTY MOVE SEEN IN HARTFORD

Social Justice Union Would Confine Itself, However, to Action in Congress.

Hartford, June 24.—(AP)—That a third party, possibly of stable proportions, will be injected into the state campaign this fall, appeared certain today in announcements of two local units of the National Union for Social Justice.

It is understood, however, that the Union's interest is confined exclusively to Congressional offices. There is no move at present to enter either the state or municipal field, a local official said, and furthermore it wasn't likely there would be any attempt to nominate candidates in either of these divisions of government.

Unit of the Union will meet tomorrow night to consider third party plans and candidates acceptable to the organization to represent the new party.

Friday Night Meeting. Friday night Unit 7 of the Union will meet at Capitol Hill, to make plans for launching the new party.

In the announcement of the meeting it states that: "All members are urged to attend so that they may secure first hand information on the new party."

John F. Coppinger, 902 Chapel street, New Haven, state superintendent of the National Union for Social Justice, declined today to comment on the launching of a state ticket or whether the Union would enter the gubernatorial race.

Several rumors today led to that Jumper McLeary of Bridgeport might be named as the gubernatorial candidate, but Mr. Coppinger said he had heard nothing about this.

Non-Communist. The possibility of a state-wide meeting of non-Communist units of the Union was indicated by Mr. Coppinger. He said, however, that he had no idea that the program of the meeting might be in the nature of a state ticket or whether the Union would enter the gubernatorial race.

At the present time, Mr. Coppinger said, "there is no statement on behalf of the Union available with respect to any third party move."
