





The American Telephone and Telegraph survey showed 33,539,890 telephones in the world on January 1, 1935, the latest date for which comparable figures are available. Of these the United States had 16,868,955, or more than half. Europe had approximately 36 per cent of the world total, and Canada and Japan about three per cent each; the remaining seven per cent were scattered through the rest of the world, in Asia, Africa, Oceania, and South and Central America.

In common with most other American telephone subscribers, Connecticut telephone subscribers, Co

connecticut telephone subscribers can today be connected with any one of more than 17,000,000 telephones in this country and some 15,000,000 in foreign lands—in all, 93 per cent of the world's total.

Connecticut, with 294,083 telephones on the census date, had more telephone, than all Africa, Austria, Poland, China or New Zealand, and more than ten times as many as Greece, Bulgaria and most South American countries. Since the world-wide figures were gathed, the number of telephones in Connecticut has increased to more than 306,000 today.

Here the average is 13.36 telephones for every hundred people; Canada ranks second with exactly 11; next-come Desmark, New Zealand, Sweden, Switzerland, Australia and Morway in the order named, ranging downward from eleven to six telephones per hundred of population as this nation.
