The total estimated cost of the 51 projects is \$485,651.75. Of that amount the town's contribution is \$51,443.35 and the federal government's share is \$424,208.40.

The total estimated expenditure for labor is \$227,097.73 of which \$3275,612.73 is from the federal government and \$11,485 is from the municipal government.

The total estimated expenditure for materials and equipment is \$585.84.92 of which the federal government and \$21,485 is from the municipal government.






