





CONNECTICUT CO. OF BUS SERVICE

Fifteen years ago today there was hardly a motor bus operating on the streets and highways of Connecticut—probably none of the type so universally known today, al-though the State had become some-what acquainted with street trans-it by motor in the then-ended era of "jitney" competition. The Con-necticut Company ha not started to operate motor coach service, and the New England Transportation Company was yet to be formed. But the present month of July marks the 15th anniversary of the start of that service. It was on July operation of two buses running be-tween Stamford and Glenbrook. Their average daily route measured only 2.67 miles with an average traveling distance each month of

traveling distance each month of about 5,500 miles.

The new service was expanded slowly at first, but from the humble start at Stamford grew the present widespread system of motor coach lines extending throughout the greater part of Connecticut. Under the late President J. K. Punderford, with Richard J. Bennett, now vice president and general manager of the company, in direct charge of the motor lines, the bus came to play a more and more important play a more and more important part in street transit in this State Today the company's motor system involves the operation of 355 motor coaches which run considerably more than 1,000,000 miles per

sion struck with full force in the latter year, the motor coach changed its status in Connecticut's street transit system from that of an auxiliary to the screet cor to that of an important transportation factor in its own right. It was used to replace trolley cars on lines where business had dropped below the point which would permit the expense of maintaining rails and electrical equipment. In the short space of five years, the length of hus route jumped by nearly 300 miles.

Buses are being employed by the Connecticut Company today not smly to replace trolley service on routes of the nature described above, but also to furnish transit service on many streets and highways where neither street car nor bus service has been rendered previously. Thus, the company by means of both buses and trolleys is sow serving more territory, alsow serving more territory, al-hough far less patrons, than when treet car route was at its peak a lecade or more ago.




