

How to Locate Two Comets Flashing Through Sky

Dates on the path give positions where the comet may be found at these times. It will be brightest and nearest the earth (close to 16 million miles) on Aug. 4. Nothing yet is known about Kaho's comet, but it can be seen, with the aid of field glasses or a small telescope, low in the western sky, just below the Big Dipper. This map is distorted slightly to include the sky ares in which both comets appear. Hold the map before you, facing north, then turn toward the west for Kaho's comet and east and southeast for Peitier's comet. Picture at upper right is that of another comet, Morehouse's, taken through the powerful telescope at Yerkes Observatory.
