Such a checking process may be accomplished by viewing the joint with the x-ray, or may be accomplished by palpating the painful area with the fingers. Palpation is the older method and when used by a doctor skilled in manipulation may accure a correct conclusion; however I suggest that the best plan is to study the slip from taking x-ray pictures of it or by looking at it with the Fluoroscope. The slip may be either up, down, backward or forward.




