WILL BY COL. GREEN DATED 1908, FOUND Situation Very Complicated; If Will Probated, Widow May Lose Estate.

Port Henry, N. Y., Aug. 7.—(AP)—A 10-word document designated as "the last will and testament" of the late Colonel Edward H. Green, was made public here today.
