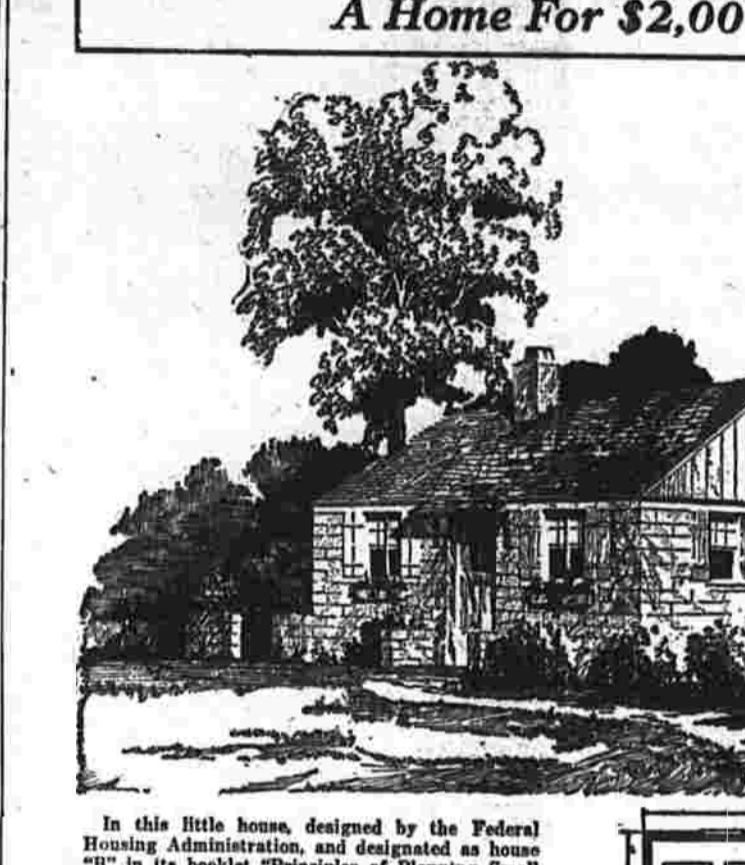

The living room is small, but the shape and wall space lend themselves to satisfactory furnishing and use. The kitchen is compact, but allows space for a small table or more cabinet space. Laundry trays could be installed in the utility room. If desired, instead of using the combination sink-and-stove fixture shown in the kitchen, if a cold range were to be used, the position of the chimney could be changed to the partition between the utility room and kitchen, making it available for the range as well as the heater.
