Tree seed crop in Connecticut will be a poor one this year. Reports received from fifteen C. C. C. camps indicate that many of the valuable timber tree species of the state such as the oaks, ash and tulip poplar have produced no crop or a very poor crop of seed. The birches, maples, white pine and hemlock have produced a slightly better crop, but in no sense can it be considered an abundant or even a good crop of seed. 
