And most of them are pretty well convinced that the solution is dams—little dams, thousands of them, all over the dry country—wherever streams have cut guilles of sufficient length and breadth to hold an acre of water or more.

Dam Pays for Itself

The idea of water storage has come to the majority of the farmers by exhample. Last year a small dam was built across a ravine southeast of Rapid City, S. D. This summer, between 1,000 and 2,300 head of cattle, representing all herds within a 10-mile radius, have been watering there daily. The da-2 cost \$4,000 and practically paid for itself in one day of watering.


