In a frantic effort to get rid of the pimples, the patient may use cintments or salves which make the trouble worse through blocking the pores of the skin. Acne is most often found among those having an cily, coarse skin and excessive ciliness of the hair and dandruff are often associated with the skin diaorder.

The causes of sche are both internal and external although in a chronic case, where the skin is angry and inflamed for months or years, the inside causes are more important than the cutside causes. The patient with sone is usually suffering from constipation and very often the diet is unwisely selected, consisting of a prependerance of sweets. Lack of sunships and incorrect habits of skin cleansing also play a contributing role in causing acne. Misguided treatment may serve to further intensify the trouble.
