





An analysis prepared by the Agriculture Department's bureau of foreign crops and markets showed the percentage of increase for exports and imports of agricultural products to be identical, as compared with the same period during 1935.

Farm products sent here from Canada in the first half of 1956 were valued at \$35,954,000 com-pared with \$25,896,000 in 1935, a gain of \$7,058,000, also 24 per cent. Non-Agricultural Non-agricultural products from lanada rose from \$100,998,000 for the first half of last year to \$123,-886,000 this year, a boest of \$22.-888,000 or 23 per cent. Non-agricultural products moving into Canada were \$158,344,000 for the first half of this year and \$140 the first haif of this year and \$140,322,000 in 1935, an increase of \$18,022,000 or 13 per cent.

The gain in movement of farm products from here to Canada was evenly split between commodities upon which duty was reduced by the pact and those on which no changes were made.
