He passed away at 10:55 a. m., eastern standard time, at Walter Reed hospital. Six members of his family were near his hand as he died.

Word immediately was telegraphed to President Roosevelt, who at the time was nearing Bismarck, N. D., aboard his special train on a drought inspection trip.

Simultaneously, orders were drafted for Army posts throughout the country to lower their flags to half staff and to fire a mourning gun every half hour after reveille tomorrow. After the blowing of retreat tomorrow night, 19-gun salutes will be fired at all posts.

Plans for the funeral of the secretary of war were not immediately announced. It was indicated his body would be taken to Utah, where only four years ago he occupied the

body would be taken to Utah, where only four years ago he occupied the governor's chair, since the law specifies that only men who served in the military forces can be buried in Arlington national cemetery here.

Army to Pay Tribute.

All of the army will pay him homage, however, with officers wearing mourning bands and black crepe upon their sabres for 30 days. A guard of honor was ordered im-A guard of honor was ordered immediately to the hospital.

There were scores of expressions of sorrow immediately after word of Dem's passing spread through the capital. Harry H. Woodring, assistant secretary of war, who becomes acting secretary and who






