

Speaking under the auspices of the Republican National committee, William Hard said in a radio address from the capital last night it was "odd" that Ickes "should not know of the Hearst activities of the son of the gentleman whom he is supporting for the presidency."

Hard went on to say that Elliott Roosevelt "Is exercising his legal and moral right to be in the Hearst service at this very time. He serves Mr. Hearst as vice president of the Hearst radio broadcasting stations in Texas and Oklahoma. He also serves him as his representative in negotiations with the Federal communications commission in Washington, x x x"
