

NO COST TO TOWN FOR NEW LIBRARY Meeting Wednesday to Act on Cheney Fund PWA Grant and Location.

The library committee, which during the last year has made preliminary plans for the construction of a building to house the Cheney Manchester Free library, shuttled about from one location to another during recent years, since its claim for support of the townpeople on the fact that the construction would cost the town or the taxpayers anything and that the institution would be a new home.

A special town meeting Wednesday at 8 p. m. in High school hall has been called to approve plans for the building to be erected on Cheney street. Buried Old 25 Years Ago In making progress to place the library committee has retraced the history of the Cheney Free library 25 years ago next month.

Wednesday night the voters will be asked to accept a PWA grant which would provide for the building to be approved for the erection of the building. The Cheney fund given several years ago by Cheney Brothers and to designate the building as the Cheney library.

Since the school year of 1913, which dates the Cheney library, along with the old Ninth District school and several dwellings, the Cheney library building has been housed in temporary accommodations until for other purposes and not suited to library uses.

With the removal of this house, the Cheney library building is being moved to a new location on Cheney street. The main reason for this is located in the Cheney library building physical training classes are being held there.

But this is one of the defects of the present quarters of the town's main library. The Cheney library is rather a shabby building with hundreds of books stored in small, unventilated rooms.

During the school hours the library serves as a high school library and as such is used by the high school high school pupils. While this arrangement is a convenience to the high school, it tends to reduce the use of the library by the general public, and in line with the town's plan to make the Cheney library a public library.

Incidentally, the library rooms have been and is to be made a part of the Cheney library building. The Cheney library building is a handsome building with a large hall and a reading room.

The Federal government will contribute 45 per cent of the cost of the undertaking and the Library Committee, if authorized, will contribute the balance. The Cheney fund is the main source of the fund given by the Cheney Brothers.
