Greece took steps to "adjust drachma" to the pound sterling. The rate of exchange was fixed at between 546 and 550 drachma to the pound.

Stock and exchange markets in Italy were closed today but the Bank of Italy ordered the Saturday official rate of 12.71 lire to the dollar paid to tourists. Transactions in French, Belgian, Swiss and Dutch currencies were prohibited.

The Italian rovernment, informed sources said, is studying issuance of tourist lire on a lower basis but authoritative observers expressed confidence there would be no devaluation of the lira.

The Belgian stock market opened for business, with transactions barred in the foreign currencies
