



Frequently small children will push beans, pleces of chalk, buttons, pencils, erasers or other materials into their noses. Sometimes they will put small toys, coins, and similar objects into their mouths and inadvertently swallow of inhale these objects.

Occasionally, too, a child will shove some foreign materials into its ears. Usually the mother becomes greatly disturbed and, in some instances, with plenty of reason.




