Boston, Oct. 15.—(AP)—John C. Gable, president of the Massachusetts Federation of Labor, today urged the Rev. Charles E. Coughlin, today termed the "most fervent Communist ever in the United States," to keep silent about his "deep and utter silence" as a priest.

He urged the priest to "stand before a mirror and listen with the ears of a true priest to some of your recent utterances, and I am quite sure that if you do this, he wrote, 'you will be obliged to impose upon yourself each a penance, that all the days of your life would not suffice to make an adequate atonement.'"

Gable's characterization of Coughlin as a Communist was based on the priest's recent speeches. "I base that assertion," he wrote, "on your alleged statement that you were in favor of bullets if bullets didn't prevail. No died-in-the-wool Communist would fail to agree with those sentiments."

You have dictated the choice of candidates for high public office, both in the Nation and in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, and your act in this connection is truly in line with the Communist philosophy of destroying the faith of the people in Democratic institutions."

In conclusion, Gable's letter read, "might I suggest that in view of the fact you wear the vestment of a highly respected Church which is loved by millions of wage earners in America, that if you continue to be a true representative of Joe Stalin in Russia, you ought at least to remove from your person the insignia of that great Church."

- 1—Here are rules that should be followed carefully in keeping a family medicine chest:
- 2—Never keep in the family medicine chest bichloride of mercury, pills containing strychnine, solutions containing wood alcohol.
- 3—Never keep any preparation of opium or morphine, or any medicine of unknown composition.
- 4—Never allow any preparation of opium or morphine to remain in the family medicine chest.
- 5—Never save any preparation after the specific need for which it was ordered by the physician has ended.
- 6—Go over the family medicine chest at least once a year, and discard all useless or spoiled materials.
- 7—When measuring out a medicine, think of what you are doing and pay no attention to anything else.
- 8—Always shake a bottle containing liquid medicine before pouring out the medicine for use.
- 9—After removing the cork from a bottle, put the cork with its top down on a table, washstand or tray. Put it back in the medicine immediately after the medicine has been poured out.
- 10—Never take a cathartic for abdominal pain unless the cause of the pain is known. It may be appendicitis.
- 11—Never take pyrazinone, or tablet which contains pyrazinone, without a doctor's prescription.
- 12—Never drop any medicine in the eye unless a doctor has recommended it.
- 13—Women's cosmetics should be kept in a place of their own, preferably wherever they are used by the woman concerned.
- 14—Never take sleeping powders, pills, tablets, or solutions unless in the amounts recommended and at the times recommended by your doctor.
- 15—Do not treat the baby for pain, spasms, skin rash, or diarrhea according to a medicine book. Do not try to treat it if affected by colic. Call your doctor. Give the baby the same chance you would want for yourself under similar conditions.

Attends Mass Daily Dictator may not really be the Spanish government to succeed either, but he recognizes the danger of intervention and has urged all nations to adopt a hands-off attitude. Her advice to her tiny nation is to become involved in the desperate conflict across the border.

Despite his long hours the dictator takes only two light meals a day, and his touchstone is the outside of Lisbon. An aged housekeeper, as meticulous as her master, attends to his simple wants. She rarely speaks to anyone but concentrates on keeping the apartment clean and preparing the doctor's frugal fare.

As a boy Oliveira Salazar was not robust. His peasant father, finding him incapable of guiding a plow, sent him to a Jesuit school. While his sisters—he had no brothers—did menial work on the paternal farm, Antonio amassed knowledge. He had a flair for mathematics, philosophy and economics—and he had ambition.

Little Known To People The Jesuit rector saw the youth's gifts and sent him to study in Portugal's ancient university. He was graduated in philosophy, economics and law.
