In a brief announcement, the tribunal agreed to pass on challenges of the legislation filed by the Associated Press and by the Washington, Virginia and Maryland Coach Company. The act was sustained by lower courts in both controversies. The statute guarantees collective bargaining to labor and restricts the National Labor Relations Board to settle unfair labor practices. It also provides for a procedure by which unions can sue to force employers to bargain with them.
