An auxiliary antenna is provided for pilots of all air line for use in radio transmission or reception. It is arranged for simultaneous use with the regular antenna.

A two-seater monoplane now being built for sale at a popular price has gas consumption per hour of 17 miles a gallon of fuel.

A flying library service has been inaugurated for persons living in communities tucked by clipper planes in Trans-Pacific service. The Honolulu public library is in charge of the service.

A slotted wing on a plane which has been developed recently is said to make a plane lighter and faster by increasing the lifting capacity of the wing. The rate of climb for planes equipped with this type wing is reported to be 1000 feet a minute, and the required takeoff distance, 100 feet.

A gigantic eight-motored flying boat now being constructed in Germany will have a Trans-Atlantic service when completed. The craft is expected to have a top speed of 350 miles an hour and a cruising speed of 160 miles an hour.

GRIDIRON HEROES

THEY make few rough-and-ready foot ball players in the modern era of the game who could stack up with Piggy Rooster, Northwestern University's all-America halfback in 1935. He was all football, and Big Ten and intercollegiate opponents of the Wildcats during his career will confirm this.
