Sufficient Produce Being Brought to Market to Warrant Continuing Sales.

Sales at the Manchester Auction market will continue for at least two weeks more. The amount of produce being brought to the market this week is high, but there are better prices expected and unless the weather becomes too cold there will be cutthroat over the market on November 22 and the sufficient crops ready to bring in to keep the market open later this year.

Sales yesterday amounted to \$407.85 and brought the daily average sales so far this week to \$400.00. There were 824 crates of No. 1 cauliflower sold yesterday for 45 cents and a lot of 25 cents, the average being but 43 cents. The second grade cauliflower offered yesterday amounted to 87 crates with a high of 25 cents and a low of 15 cents and an average yesterday five bushels of tubers for 30 cents a bushel and 46 tubers for 25 cents a bushel and 51 high and a low of 50 cents with an average of 45 cents. No. 2 potatoes sold for 20 cents a bushel.

Teachers Asked to Train Children as "Failures"

A Salt Lake City, Oct. 30.—(AP)—A noted psychologist contended today that the educational system is suffering from an overdose of success stories and advised teachers to train their pupils to become "failures."

Dr. Mandel Sherman, mental hygiene specialist at the University of Chicago, made the assertion to the Education Association.

"We must train pupils to become failures, in the ordinary sense of the word, because—there only very few will be considered successes—they will be failures in later life," he said.

"One pupil in 10 is successful, one in 20 is mediocre, one in 30 is a failure. The student who is thus a success without himself acquires a poor disregard for the common conception of success."

Dr. Sherman said this new concept of education is only but certainly gaining ground.

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STATE BULLETIN REPORTS LOBAR PNEUMONIA RISE

Lobar pneumonia shows indications of being on the increase in Connecticut this year, despite the fact that the season of the disease is only starting, the State Department of Health warned in a weekly bulletin.

In October, 1934, there were 43 cases. In October, 1935, there were 65 cases. For the three weeks ending October 28, there have been 98 cases reported in 28 towns, against 105 cases reported for the corresponding three weeks in 1935.
