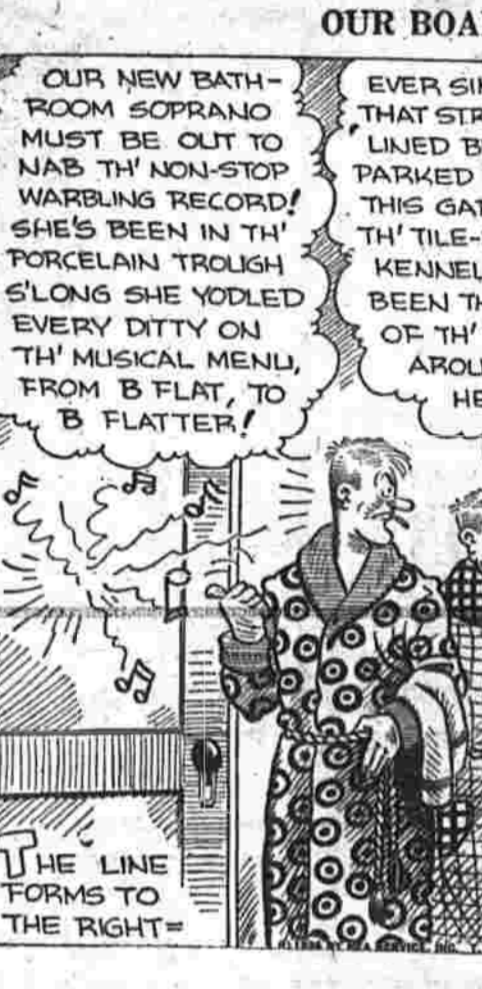

SIX NEW BRIDGE JOBS LISTED ON STATE HIGHWAYS
Highway Commissioner John A. Macdonald today announced a large program of bridge construction and highway surface improvement to be added to the already large amount of work in progress throughout the state. The new projects, 12 in number, call for the building of new bridges, including two railroad grade crossing eliminations, and the improvement of about 18 miles of road surface. Also included among the projects is a highway grade separation structure on the New Meritt Parkway.

North Haven, the familiar railroad crossing on the New Haven-Hartford highway at the North Haven station will be eliminated by the construction of a viaduct, and in the Town of Fairfield a bridge will be built over the railroad on Long Mountain road. The work announced by Commissioner Macdonald today is briefly described as follows:

Rocky Hill: A bridge over the railroad and about 2,140 feet of reinforced concrete pavement at the intersection of Lake Avenue (U. S. Route No. 6) and Abbott Avenue.

North Haven: A 40-foot span T-beam bridge and about 500 feet of rolled iron grating approaches at the West Aspetuck river crossing on U. S. Route No. 6 at North Haven railroad station to eliminate the present grade crossing.

Boiled bank run gravel and reinforced concrete approaches, length 2,300 feet.

Town of Thompson: A 20-foot span bridge over the railroad and about 600 feet of rolled iron grating at the French river on Porter Falls road.

State Projects

Town of East Granby: A 38-inch reinforced concrete pipe culvert under Route No. 9 at Granby station.

Town of West Granby: A reinforced concrete rigid frame bridge on the Merritt Parkway at Darin road about 1,250 feet of grating on the Merritt Parkway and alternate of about 3,200 feet of bituminous concrete (Warrville Type) or Asphaltic Concrete (Coltrona Process) on the Darin road.

Town of Brookfield: About 4,085 feet of rolled bank run gravel on the Able and Powder Hill roads.

Town of Norfolk: A 28-foot span bridge over the railroad on the Blackberry Place at the Blackberry Place.
