





Electric utilities stand ready to render advice on lighting to their customers without cost.

Most electric companies have at least one and often several trained employees whose duty it is to assist customers in this direction. Frequently it is possible to achieve good lighting merely by rearranging existing fixtures, and when changes are found necessary their cost is practically negligible in comparison with the advantages obtained for the eyes. For several years past, offices and factories have been improving lighting facilities, but too often it is found that a person who works under good light at the office or shop sits evening after evening at home abusing eyes under poor lighting conditions, the home lighting advisors state.

To promote better sight the proper quality, quantity and direction of the light is necessary.

The quality of llumination generally fails into two groups, namely hard and soft light. Hard light, the poorer of the two is a direct undiffused light which is harmful to the yes as it increases the muscular train on the optic nerves. Such lighting causes eyestrain, headaches, stomach trouble, and general nervous disorders. On the other hand, a well diffused light permits enough light on the object so that one can enjoy performing the eye-tasks much more aggressively and with greater case. much more aggressively and with greater case.

Proper quantity, like proper quality, is indispensable to good lighting. Contrary to the general belief, plenty of light does not mean glare. In a well lighted room the quantity of light varies from general to special illumination. There are two reasons for general lighting. One is a fety. The second, avoiding contrast glare—the undesirable effect of a light object on a dark background. Special lighting is needed where one reads, studies, sews, or does any amount of close work. As a person grows older the pupils of his eyes grow smaller, therefore they need much more light than a child does in order to perform the same task as quickly.

The direction of light should fall from above the opposite shoulder of the hand which does the work, in ver place lamps behind colored furniture as color absorbs light very readily, therefore part of the light is lost which should have been used for seeing.




