FRENCH GROUPS ACCUSE EACH OF URGING REVOLT

Fascists, Communists, Assert Plots Are On Foot to Have Army, Navy Aid in a Revolution.

Paris, Nov. 6. (AP)—French politicians today accused each other of attempting to influence the Army and Navy in a revolutionary plot against President Leon Blum's Socialist government.

The Chamber of Deputies, meanwhile gave solid support to the proposal for revision of provincial taxes, voting a preliminary bill unanimously.

Heated accusations were being heard in the Chamber of Deputies in the Senate and the followers of Francois de La Rocque, head of the Fascist social party.

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LABORITES WHO HELPED F. D. R. URGE NEW LAWS

Push for Revised NRA or Amendment; Dems. Now Have 75 Senate Seats As Dickinson Falls in Iowa.

Washington, Nov. 6. (AP)—The triumph return of President Roosevelt to the capital today found powerful Labor groups, who backed him so strongly for re-election, pressing for new legislation reminiscent of New Deal laws, and for a major change in the Social Security act.

The American Federation of Labor officials tentatively mapped plans to ask the next Congress to shift the whole Social Security payroll tax to employers, instead of collecting part of it from workers, as proposed in the present law.

An Mr. Roosevelt wants home to receive an unprecedented throng of thousands of Washingtonians, who expected him to give renewed attention to the problem of unemployment.

This problem is linked directly with that of relief expenditures, which in turn bulk large in the present budget. The Labor groups are expected to urge the administration to take a new move to attain certain NRA objectives.

Speculation as to what this move would be, is being kept alive by a proposal to amend the Constitution to attempt to obtain the Supreme Court approval of new plans designed to raise and stabilize wages, shorten "over-long" hours and ban "unfair" trade practices.

The Democratic platform came out for a "clarifying" amendment to the Constitution which would have proved impossible to tackle wage, hour and trade practice problems within the Constitution as it is now written.

Meantime labor leaders were pressing strongly for a Federal anti-trust bill, which would prohibit the "Supreme Court in the spot; the people and the people's representatives," on union leader declared.

The "Welcome Home" sign for Roosevelt today, belated returns to the New Deal victory in Tuesday's election.

Members of his Cabinet, others who were expected to attend, were disappointed to learn that Roosevelt would not be in Washington.

Secretary Edward F. McNulty, who declared he came back to try to balance the budget, thereby carrying out the first aim of his administration.

Even as Mr. Roosevelt returned, however, he looked forward to his trip to the West Coast, where he will be met by the American Peace Commission.

The Union states crowd, estimated by Mayor Frank W. Snow, superintendent of police, at "well over 100,000," is expected to arrive in the city by the American Peace Commission.

67,000 WORKERS TO GET BONUS OF 4 MILLIONS

Head of Chrysler Corporation Says Good Business Is Reason for Move; Other Wage Increases.

Detroit, Nov. 6. (AP)—K. T. Keller, president of the Chrysler corporation, announced today that the automobile manufacturing firm will distribute a \$4,000,000 bonus among 67,000 employees at the end of the year.

The bonus will be distributed in three installments, the first being paid today. Keller said the bonus was a result of the company's good business during the year.

Other wage increases were also announced today. The Chrysler Corporation will increase the wages of its 67,000 employees by 3 to 5 percent.

Widow of President's Adviser Says Results Vindicated the New Deal.

Fall River, Mass., Nov. 6.—(AP)—Mrs. Louis McHenry Howe, widow of President Roosevelt's adviser and secretary for 25 years said today her husband would have advised the Roosevelt landslide as a "vindication of everything the President tried to do."

"I don't think he would have been so terribly surprised at the President's vote," she said. "He would have expected it."

"But if he were here now there would be no celebration. Louis would go right on working."

"In 1928 I sat all election night in his office across Madison avenue from the National committee headquarters in New York," she said. "The President was in the Billings receiving room but Louis stayed in his office getting returns."

"Four years ago I wanted him to take a rest after the campaign but he told me, 'Most of our other campaigns we lost so there was plenty of time to rest; this time we won, we can't stop now.'"

ITALIAN FAMILIES START COLONIZING

Vanguard of "Agricultural Warriors" Establish a Colony Near Addis Ababa.

Addis Ababa, Nov. 6.—(AP)—With their bayonets figuratively beaten into plowshares, 400 ex-soldiers and their families will establish an agricultural colony in the highlands region, 25 miles east of Addis Ababa. It was announced today.

They will form the vanguard of Italy's "agricultural warriors," seeking to great crops from land once rudely tilled by native Ethiopians.

Now that the rainy season is over, Italy's development of her new Empire is proceeding swiftly.

Thirteen joint-stock companies have already started surveying raw material resources of the African continent and are now according to government promise, are being organized to exploit the industrialists interested in the products dealt with, who wish to enter.

"They go on the assumption, as the Italian government's official states, that 'the available information on Ethiopia's natural resources is scanty and unreliable, but the country is known to possess large deposits of mineral ores and can produce cotton, wool, and other textiles.'"

"It is suited for large scale cattle raising and the raising of sheep, the meat and dairy industries; it can be used for raising and skins of the forest and valuable lumber in the west and central parts of the country, and large quantities of the excellent, and later, to be used for territory lend themselves to agricultural development."

The companies cover: Mining, for which "The Ethiopian Company" has a capital of 10,000,000 lire which can be raised to 20,000,000.

"The Italian Company for Annual Husbandry Studies and Stock Raising" has an initial capital of 1,000,000 lire which can be increased to 20,000,000.

"The Ethiopian Cotton Company" has a capital of 2,000,000 lire which can be raised to 20,000,000.

"The Ethiopian Company for Milk and Milk Products Industry" capital 500,000, to be raised to 10,000,000.

"Imperial Company for the Utilization of Ethiopian Wood" capital 1,000,000 to be raised to 20,000,000.

"Ethiopian Textile Fibre Company" capital 1,000,000.

Oleum seeds: "The Ethiopian Seed and Fruit Company" capital 500,000 to be raised to 10,000,000.

"Tanning" "The Ethiopian Tanning Company" capital 1,000,000 to be raised to 10,000,000.

In addition to these broad-scale companies, 50 industrial firms, with capital resources varying from 2,000,000 lire to 50,000,000, have been authorized to start business in the new Empire.

Other new companies organized or line similar to those for exploiting natural resources have been formed to assist the roadbuilding and house and factory building enterprises, such as the "Ethiopian Cement Works" Company with capital of 20,000,000 lire, "The Brick Industry in Ethiopia" Company, with capital 5,000,000 to be raised to 20,000,000, and "The National Company for Electric Enterprises in Ethiopia," capital 20,000,000 to be raised to 100,000,000.
