

A Washington Daybook

Washingon—So solidly are both in competition with private indusparties pledged to the elimination of monopoly (define it your own way) that to many it appears almost certain congress will attempt framing new machinery to deal with it.

The primary aim of any anti-monopoly drive is to break down rigid price structures. When agreements are reached among producers, manufacturers or others to keep prices at a certain level, then, most economists agree, much of the value of the competitive system is lost.

Under a competitive system when consumer buying power lags, sellers may resort to cutting prices to a point which again will stimulate consumer demand. Thus they seek it keep production steady.

But when monopoly prevails, an effort may be made to keep prices up, where profits are fatter, even in the face of clackening demand. Unless stimulus comes from other sources (such as government spending, consumer loans, etc.) production slackens, jobs decrease, consumption lags further and a vicious* spiral begins.

Fro and Con
Industrialists often contend that high, rigid wage levels, forced to a degree by labor organizations, make price reduction impossible. Foes of monopoly in congress and elsewhere insint it is employed mostly as a means of extracting excessive profits.

Already one weapon traditionally used to thwart monopoly is in operation—the "yardstick." Tennesse Valley Authority is an example, Put
