





One of the best is "The Life and Adventures of John Nicol, Mariner" (Farrar and Rinehart). This is the simple and very often beautiful record of Nicol's life at sea—the young man well taught in matters of religion and conduct who often forgot his teaching when anchored off an island full of co-operative female natives; through to the old man who looks for the time "when I shall enter my less ship and be anchored with a green turf upon my breast." 
