

-What You Should Know About-NEW SOCIAL SECURITY LAW

When Mr. Worker fills out the application for a Social Security account which his employer will hand him—one step in the program to set up initial wage records of those employees for whom Federal Old-Age Benefits begin to accrue January 1, 1937, under the Social Security Act—he can rest assured that the information he gives will be treated in a confidential manner by the Social Security Board.

The same assurance is made to employers, who on November 16 were given blanks entitled "Employer's Application for Identification Number."

The employee has the opportunity of using five means of returning his application, and can choose any one of a number which will insure privacy in regard to the information given.

He can put his application in a sealed envelope addressed to his local postmaster and mail it.

He can deliver it to the postoffice himself.

He can give it to the labor organization with which he is affiliated. O. RETURNED BY EMPLOYEE AND EMPLOYER?

He can hand it to his employer.

He can hand it to a letter carrier.

In none of these instances is he required to pay postage.

As a matter of fact, the information given on the application is probably less detailed than the information which the employer already has in his personnel files.

Only a few simple questions are asked, such as name and address; date and place of birth, and father's and mother's full names.

As Britain objected to the presence of French troops in Syria, it was agreed that France, Britain, Germany, Russia, Italy and Austria-Hungary should take Lebanon under their protection and give her autonomy. and give her autonomy.

After the World War Syria and Lebanon were turned over to France under mandate—Lebanon being created a Republic.

The new treaties provide that Lebanon shall be autonomous after three years, but France will continue to give protection and maintain troops. This is said to be the wish of the Christians of Lebanon.

The treaty with the other parts of Syria is understood to be similar, except that French troops will be withdrawn after three years.


