





total amount of wages up to \$3000 a year which the worker has
received from any one employer during all the time he has
worked in occupations covered by the act.

Computation of wages begins with the year 1937. If the worker is employed in five different years after January 1, 1937, if his
total wages for this employment amount to more than \$2000, and
if he retires at the age of 65, he is eligible for monthly old-age
benefits, regardless of where he worked, or in how many places
he worked.




