









PENSION LEADER INDICTED BY JURY

Dr. Townsend, Two Associates Charged With Contempt As Result of Probe

Washington, Dec. 8.—(AP)—Dr. Francis H. Townsend, co-author of the Townsend old-age pension movement, and two associates were indicted by a Federal Grand Jury today on contempt charges growing out of their defiance of a Congressional investigating committee.

The Grand Jury returned the indictments less than two weeks after the case was presented to it. Specifically, they charged Townsend with "knowingly" obstructing the committee's investigation of a pension bill.

(Continued from Page One) The British cabinet's disapproval of his possible marriage to the Duke of Windsor, American friends and their presumptuous refusal to let the king marry, and the king's own decision to postpone the wedding until after his return to London.

The king, however, refused to let the Duke of Windsor, his personal adviser, among whom he numbers his brother, the Duke of York, to whom he has divorced two husbands, to be his personal secretary.

Prime Minister Baldwin sat tight at his official Downing street residence, waiting for the king to return to London.

At 2:30 p. m., Prime Minister Baldwin, following a two-hour conference with the king, had the king's secretary, Lord Dowding, call to face what seemed to be a crucial moment of his career.
