Portsmouth, N. H., Dec. 9.—(AP)—A view of municipal matters, Goldsmith, son of one of Portsmouth's oldest families, asserted, "I think it is too young to be mayor and there is anyone older or more experienced who desires the office and should be elected."

Paris, Dec. 9.—(AP)—The German Junkers warplane abruptly attacked and shot down a French airplane over Spanish territory.
