

Obviously, since literary men don't often die at the turn of a century, just to please future compilers of biographies, both the 18th and the 20th century are given some attention. The authors included are those who published the major part of their work in the 19th century.

Nor are writers from the dominions excluded. There are a few, rather surprisingly few, from Canada, Australia, South Africa and even New Zealand. The editors have concluded each sketch with a list of the subjects chief works, especially valuable in connection with the lesser known writers.

And they have, consciously or otherswise, provided another parlor game. Do you know, for instance, who wrote "Twinkie, Twinkie, Little Star?" Or what novelist served a prison term in his youth? Or what popular Scotish novelist died in Iowa? Or what novelist sent 4,000 people to call on a certain lady in one day? Perhaps you don't know and don't care. But if you do, "British Authors" is your source book.





The factories, consuming 1,500 tons of potatoes a year will turn out 1,500,000 gallons of alcohol.


