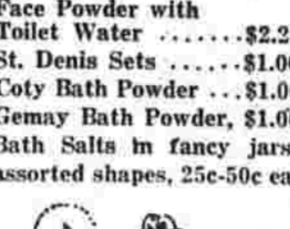

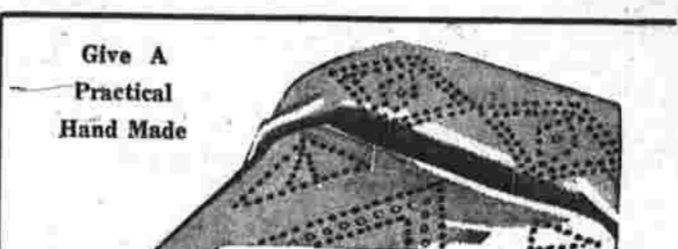

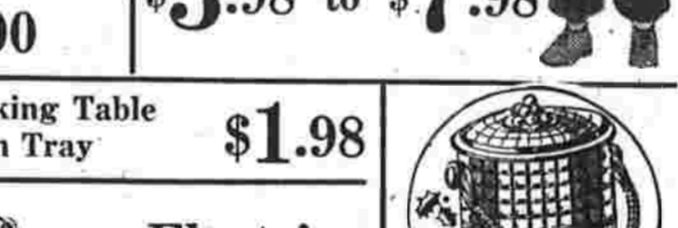

Eastern-Ski Fans Face Another Green Weekend

Heavy Rain Leaves Trails Barren of Snow; Conditions Fair in Mt. Mansfield Area of Vermont; Big Year for Winter Sports.

Boston, Dec. 18.—(AP)—New England ski trails, hazy by frequent rainfalls, were generally barren of snow today, and thousands of skiers faced another green week-end.

Only the Mt. Mansfield area in northern Vermont offered anything like fair conditions. There was a light snowfall in New Hampshire and western Massachusetts.

Despite the lack of snow, however, there was plenty of evidence that winter sports are in for a big year. Manufacturers of ski equipment reported unprecedented sales.

In Newport, Vt., manufacturers of ski skis, winterbreakers, caps, mittens, gloves and jackets and equipment reported unprecedented sales.

Oklahoma City.—(AP)—Governor E. W. Marland, who once headed the \$200,000,000 Marland oil company, now the "Continental," plans to stage a come-back in the oil business.
