BOOKS INDICATE HOWE DIDN'T PAY OWN TAXES

Apparently Neglected to File Liens Against His Property, Auditors Report to Selectmen Shows.

Former Tax Collector George H. Howe apparently did not pay taxes on property owned by him and did not file liens against the property as required by law, during five of the 16 years from 1921 to 1937, according to a report submitted last night by Mr. Alexander to the selectmen.

No Record of Liens. The property has since been transferred and the tax can not be collected. The taxes which Mr. Howe neglected to pay were for the years 1921, 1922, 1923, 1924, 1925, 1926, 1927, 1928, 1929, 1930, 1931, 1932, 1933, 1934, 1935, 1936, 1937, 1938.
