BOYS FIRING RIFLE, ONE SHOT IN CHIN

Six Year Old Lad Injured As He Steps Into Line of Fire, Truck Is Hit. Francis Sumalski, 6, son of Mr. and Mrs. Louis Sumalski of 12 Kerry street, was taken to the Manchester Memorial hospital yesterday afternoon after he had been shot in the chin by a 22 caliber bullet from a rifle in the hands of Robert Galley, 14, of Union street.

The two boys were on Union street and the older boy, who also owned the gun, told Lieutenant William Huron, that he was shooting at a tin can in the lot to the west of Union street. As he was about to pull the trigger, the six-year-old Sumalski boy stepped in front of the rifle and the bullet lodged in his chin.

This morning the bullet was removed, X-rays having been taken soon after the boy was brought to the hospital. On being operated upon the bullet was found to be in the chin but it was not possible to remove the bullet this morning.

One of many cases of the injury to the youth now in the hospital is the most serious of numerous instances of the use of firearms in thickly settled areas by boys and girls. It is estimated that in 1937, 12 to 16 years old, according to the police who have been deluged with complaints through the last few years.

In a campaign to disarm the children, the police have been conferring with William F. Thoms, chief of the last two weeks. All are 12 to 16 years of age. The second during the last four days are all apparently new. Christmas presents, had made no attempt to convert the situation and the police have been unable to locate the parents of the children for "suing" the minors and for furnishing them to use the guns within the town limits.

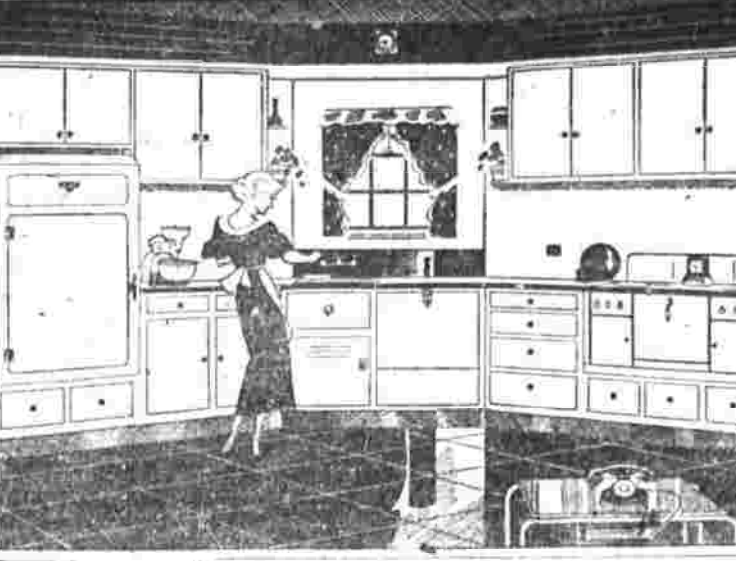
